MARCH 1 – TRACES OF THE TRADE

A Story from the Deep North, filmmaker Katrina Browne discovers that her New England ancestors were the largest slave-trading family in U.S. history. This movie provides a new perspective about the story of her ancestors and the generalizations about historical American slave trade.

MARCH 8 – TRACES OF THE TRADE: THE DISCUSSION

We will grapple with the eye-opening issues that were raised by this movie and relate them to our life in this world. What do we do when we uncover uncomfortable truths about our past?

MARCH 15 – A SUDANESE CHRISTMAS

The Rev'd Joe Chambers will discuss his experience from spending Christmas in Southern Sudan. You can expect pictures, movies, and stories of his time in Sudan and his understanding of the Sudanese spiritual wealth.

MARCH 29 – THE POSTURE OF PRAYER

We will uncover Jesus' service of foot washing, the soteriological significance of Good Friday, and the freedom of the Great Vigil of Easter.
